

STRONG SUBMISSION GUIDELINES

Thinking of nominating someone for an ISC2 Global Achievement Award? For your nominee to have their best chance at being recognized for their achievements, be sure you submit a strong submission. Here are some guidelines that you can do to ensure your submission is strong:

- Successful nomination packages demonstrate a strong focus on the main contributions of the nominee, highlighting the importance of their work. It includes specific details about the nominees' accomplishments that addresses questions asked for each award criteria. If supporting letters are included, it would delve into the topics highlighted in the nomination details.
- Be explicit about which of the primary criteria the nominee has been nominated for.
- Focus on the broader significance of the nominee's contributions and the impact of their work. The submission should recognize the individual for the impact that they provided to the cybersecurity community, not just for a project they have completed. Also provide details of not only their accomplishments, but their capabilities and experiences.
- Provide a variety of examples of your nominee's accomplishments that are tangible
 examples of their contributions to cybersecurity. Ensure the examples show measurable
 effectiveness, demonstrate community engagement, and prove that their commitment is
 more than just a job.
- Write the nomination for the non-specialist and avoid the use of acronyms and jargon.
 Member of the review committee(s) may fully understand the specifics of the nominee's contribution to the cybersecurity profession but may or may not have expertise in the nominee's field.
- If possible, provide supporting documentation or materials such as a CV/resume, magazine write ups, etc. If your nominee has a LinkedIn account, provide their profile link in the appropriate location of the nomination form.
