Steps to Getting Certified

Obtain the Required Experience

To qualify for the CCFP, you must have a four-year college degree leading to a Baccalaureate, or regional equivalent, plus three years of cumulative paid full-time digital forensics or IT security experience in three or more of the **six domains** (those who do not have a degree must have six years of experience):

- » Legal and Ethical Principles
- » Investigations
- » Forensics Science
- » Digital Forensics
- » Application Forensics
- » Hybrid and Emerging Technologies

Take the Exam

Candidates are given four hours to complete the **125 question** CCFP exam. CCFP is available worldwide with regional adapted exams for the United States, European Union, India, and South Korea.
